GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

1. The maximum volume of article is up to five pages. The manuscript should be submitted in Microsoft Word format,
2. The main text of the theses is typed in a text editor MS WORD in "Times New Roman" font, size 14 pt with one and a half spacing. All margins of the page - 2.5 cm; binding - 0. Word wrap - automatic.
3. Information about the authors is typed on the second line with alignment to the right of the page without indentation. After the initials and surnames of each author, his academic degree and / or academic title, position, e-mail address are indicated, the name and the location of the organization (country, city). Word hyphenations in information about authors **are not allowed!**
4. The title of the article (no more than 10 words) is typed after the information about the authors with one-line skip, in **CAPITAL** letters in **bold**, aligned to **the center** of the page. The title of the work should adequately reflect its content and be as short as possible. Word hyphenations in the title of the article **are not allowed!**
5. Abstract of the article: 100-150 words, font size - 12; division of the text into paragraphs and the use of numbered lists is not allowed (the heading "Abstract" is in italics);
6. Keywords (the phrase "Keywords" is in italics): no more than 5 words / phrases, font size - 12;
7. **The main text** of the article is typed one line after the title with alignment to the page width. Paragraph indent - 1.5 cm., font size - 12;
8. **It is not allowed** to use footnotes, bookmarks, numbered lists (numbering of items, subsections, as well as the bibliographic list should be done manually).
9. For headings and subheadings, **it is prohibited** to use special styles and underlines.
10. References in the text to the cited literature are given in square brackets - [Ivanov 2003, 56]. All abbreviations and symbols are deciphered in the text.
11. After the end of the main text of the article, the heading **List of References (in bold)** is typed through the line, aligned to the center of the page. One line after the title, bibliographic descriptions of literary sources are typed in the order of their citation in the text or in alphabetical order with a paragraph indent of 1.5 cm and alignment along the page width, drawn up in accordance with the requirements of **GOST R 7.0.5-2008**.
12. Pages **are not numbered**.
13. The plagiarism rate should not exceed 35%

Upon receipt of an article (with a review) and an application, the Organizing Committee within 3 working days checks the text of the article for compliance with the requirements and sends the confirmation, as well as a link.
